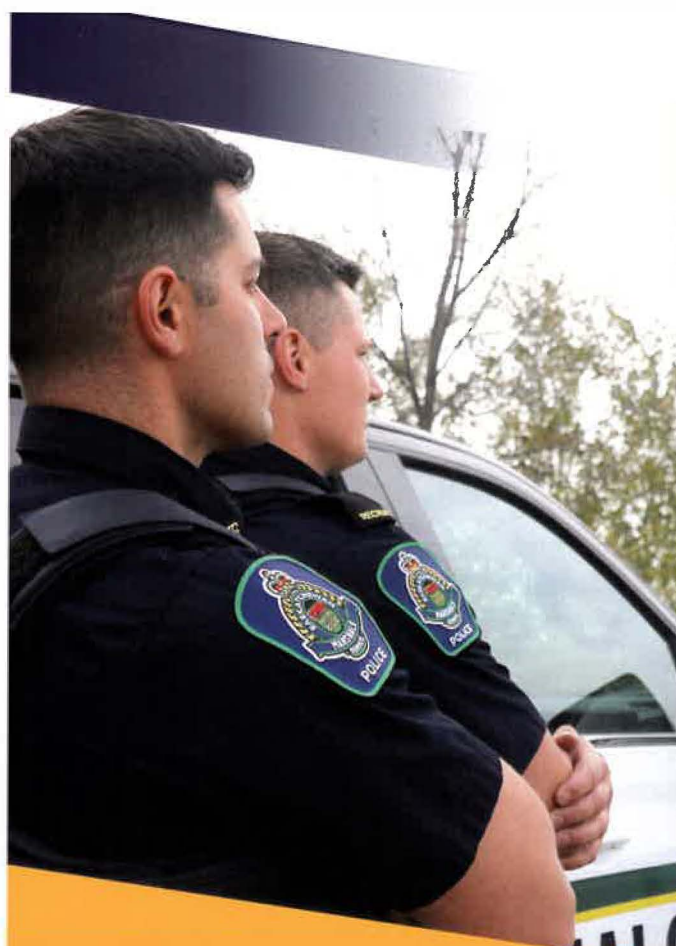

WHAT WE DO

- Identify high-risk offenders who pose significant threats
- Locate and arrest individuals wanted on warrants
- Support local police services through intelligence-led operations
- Engage with communities to build trust and understanding

SMS operations are designed to minimize disruption to local police services while enhancing overall public safety.

FAQS

- If I require police assistance, how do I contact the SMS?
 - You don't call SMS directly. Contact your local police service, and they will involve SMS if needed.
- Will SMS respond if I call 911?
 - No. Your local police service responds to 911 calls. They may request SMS support depending on the situation.
- Can SMS enforce all laws in Saskatchewan?
 - Yes, with a focus on provincial priorities such as gangs, illegal weapons and drugs, along with apprehending prolific high-risk offenders and wanted individuals.
- How are the Marshals trained?
 - All SMS members are trained in accordance with provincial policing standards. New recruits must attend the 22-week training program at the Saskatchewan Police College located in Regina, Saskatchewan.

HOW WE WORK WITH LOCAL POLICE

Your local police service - known as the **police of jurisdiction** - responds to all 911 calls and day-to-day community needs.

SMS supports them by:

- Conducting targeted enforcement on high-risk individuals
- Sharing intelligence and coordinating arrest plans
- Reducing operational strain so local officers can focus on community priorities

This collaborative model ensures safer communities across Saskatchewan.
